



COVID 19 Decision Tree – STUDENTS

Yes, Student has symptoms with no alternative explanation or medical diagnosis

NO, Student does not have SYMPTOMS

Contact your assigned Superintendent when in doubt or need to discuss more thoroughly.

A Common Symptoms

- Fever (Over 100.4°F)
- Loss of smell or taste
- Cough
- Unexplained muscle aches
- Sore throat
- Shortness of breath
- Chills
- New or unusual headache
- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, or loss of appetite

C Is Student aware of contact /exposure with someone who has been diagnosed with or tested positive for Covid-19?

B

STUDENTS/PARENTS WILL

1. Notify administrator and stay home or if at school, student will be isolated and need to be picked up within 60 minutes
2. Contact physician and follow medical care
3. Obtain COVID-19 Test

ADMINISTRATOR WILL

1. Contact Pastor (if applicable) & OCSC

F Yes, there was direct physical or close contact (less than 6 feet) for 15 minutes or more where one or both parties were **not** using face masks or coverings. If **not vaccinated or not COVID positive in the last 90 days** follow instructions below.

Students who are fully vaccinated or tested COVID positive in the last 90 days, go to **Section H**.

STUDENTS/PARENTS WILL

1. Notify administrator
2. Contact child's physician
3. Monitor by checking for fever and symptoms
4. **Asymptomatic student (unvaccinated or not COVID positive in the last 90 days)** may remain in school if:
 - a. S/he wears a mask for **5 days** from the date of last exposure. (if exposure is in the household, wears mask 5 days during quarantine of COVID positive person plus additional 5 days.)
5. **Asymptomatic student (unvaccinated or not COVID positive in the last 90 days) chooses not to wear a mask** in school during quarantine period, **must** remain at home until:
 - a. **5 days** have passed since the date of the last exposure.
6. If the student becomes symptomatic following exposure to an individual that has tested positive for COVID-19, go to **Section B**

ADMINISTRATOR WILL

1. Notify Pastor (if applicable) & OCSC
2. Communicate with parents about when child can return to school

G No, the student is unaware of any contact with someone who is infected or diagnosed with Covid-19

STUDENTS/PARENTS WILL

1. Continue practicing social distancing, good hygiene, and other preventative measures as directed by the school and CDC

ADMINISTRATOR WILL

1. No specific action is needed

If Student Tests Positive

D

STUDENTS/PARENTS WILL

1. Notify administrator of result
2. Contact individuals outside of school community with whom child had close contact
3. Continue medical care as instructed
4. Return to school only after: **5 days** since symptoms first appeared or tested positive **and** 24 hours with no fever without the use of fever-reducing medications **and** other symptoms of COVID-19 are improving. **Student must wear a mask for 5 days upon return.**

ADMINISTRATOR WILL

1. Notify Pastor (if applicable) & OCSC
2. Contact trace in school using seating charts and asking student for close contacts
3. Notify teachers and students who were identified as close contact
4. Implement school contingency plan, if necessary, after consultation with local health department, Pastor, and OCSC
5. Send general communication to staff and parent community
6. Complete the OCSC COVID-19 Reporting Form

If Student Tests Negative

E

STUDENTS/PARENTS WILL

1. Notify Administrator of result (copy of results to administrator)
2. Continue medical care as instructed
3. Return to school after 24 hours have passed since recovery (No fever and general improvement of symptoms)

H A student who is fully vaccinated and/or has received a positive diagnostic test for COVID-19 in the previous 90 days and is known to have been in direct contact with an individual who has received a positive diagnostic test for COVID-19 **may remain in school without further restrictions.**

NOTE: During periods of high positivity rates, fully vaccinated students or those who have received a positive diagnostic test for COVID-19 in the previous 90 days are encouraged to wear a mask after exposure.

Last Exposure is last time of contact with COVID positive person.

If the COVID positive person is in the household of the student, then last exposure is the day COVID positive person completes isolation or quarantine.
